## **CONFIRMATION IS A CHOICE**

Dear Friends,

Twenty-two years ago, when my older daughter, Christine, was confirmed. She wrote:

Hey, I'm getting confirmed this Sunday. And pretty much all of us know what Confirmation is, right? A "coming of age" into Christianity. It can only be performed by a bishop; it's got to be pretty big, right? Unlike baptism as children, this is something we choose to do, of our own free will. I mean, just because a baby's crying doesn't mean the bishop is going to screech, "HOLD THE BAPTISM!" Just 'cuz you're wailing doesn't mean you're not going to get dunked.

But this...this is something we choose. We accept what it means to be a Christian, and consciously pledge our lives to God. If we wail or cry this time, the bishop isn't going to say, "TOO BAD, BROTHA'!" and hold us down, kicking and screaming, while he calmly proclaims the Confirmation rites.

That's not what Confirmation is about...that's not what Christianity is about. One of the biggest things about Christianity is free will...I think God wants living, breathing people, with all of our mistakes and faults. Because, with all of our blundering stupidity, with so many distractions and easy wayouts, it just makes our choices so much more valuable.

And that's why Confirmation is, literally, a choice. We choose to follow God, to obey him, to live our lives according to his will. That's a big commitment,

especially in a world such as ours, where commitments are avoided like the plague. Confirmation isn't just a one-nighter. It's an exclusive bond between us and God, as we proudly proclaim that we really do want to follow him... We're stating that church isn't just a tradition; it's a way of life. A promise that we're willing to make; a life that we're willing to live.

In short, it's a big deal. I seriously hope I'm mature enough to make such a choice, but I'm definitely willing to try. And so, during this week, with way too many things going on, and with me staying up much later than I should, I find myself tired...but I'm still looking forward to my Confirmation. It isn't something I'm going to sleep through, no matter how tired I may be. After all, that's what Saturdays are for, right? Sleeping, I mean.

Perhaps you too would like to be confirmed. Good news—the Bishop will be here on October 12 for confirmations once again. If you are already confirmed, but would like to reaffirm your commitment to Jesus, you can do that too. I've personally found that to be a helpful practice, and so plan on doing so again this year. Beyond confirmation, Christine also demonstrates a profound understanding of what it means to follow Jesus—and the cost of doing so that she was already experiencing. It requires the hard choices that are the essence of commitment, and without which there really is no commitment at all.

Whether you are going to be confirmed or reaffirmed or not, I do hope you'll make the choice to join us this September at St. Matt's.

# BAPTISM, CONFIRMATION, RECEPTION & REAFFIRMATION

## UNDERSTANDING BAPTISM, CONFIRMATION, RECEPTION & REAFFIRMATION

We are so blessed to have so many people as part of our St. Matt's family, and we hope some of you will consider making a public affirmation of your faith during the **Bishop's Visit on Sunday, October 12, 2025.** If you've been wondering about Baptism,
Confirmation, Reception, or Reaffirmation, here's what each means:

### **Baptism - Welcomed Into God's Family**

Baptism is initiation into the body of Christ. Through water and the Holy Spirit, we are welcomed into the quirky, challenging, love- and grace-filled community of the Church. Baptism is an outward and visible sign of God's inward grace, marking the start of life with God.

### **Confirmation – Choosing Christ for Yourself**

Confirmation is for those who were baptized earlier (often as children) and now wish to make their own mature commitment to Christ. Through the laying on of hands by the Bishop, you affirm your baptismal vows and claim your faith in a personal way.

### Reception - Welcoming You Into the Episcopal Church

Reception is for those baptized and confirmed in another Christian tradition who now find a spiritual home in the Episcopal Church. It is the Church's way of formally receiving you and celebrating your commitment to live as an Episcopalian.



Mark your calendar for Sunday, October 12. We are honored to welcome the Rt. Rev. Mark Bourlakas, who will be with us in worship and lead the celebrations of Confirmation, Baptism, Reaffirmation, and Reception.

#### Reaffirmation – Renewing Your Promises

Reaffirmation is for those who were baptized and confirmed in the Episcopal Church but wish to renew their baptismal promises in a very intentional way. This may follow a return after time away, a crisis of faith, or a season of deep growth.

### **CONFIRMATION CLASSES**

If you are ready to make a public declaration of your faith, this is a wonderful opportunity to do so. Confirmation preparation classes will be held at the following dates and times. **You only need to choose one series that works best with your schedule.** 

- Group 1- Wednesdays: September 24, October 1 and 8 at 7PM
- Group 2- Thursdays: September 25, October 2 and 9 at 12PM
- Group 3- Saturday: October 4, 10AM–2PM. Lunch will be provided.

Preparing for confirmation involves time for reflection, learning, and spiritual growth. Your presence at all sessions is part of that commitment.

Classes are open to all, but are required for those who wish to be confirmed.


