MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

REV. ROB MEROLA

Dear Friends,

In virtually every one of the Annual Reports I've written for the last 23 years, we've celebrated the many ways God was leading us forward and blessing us with increase. But at the start of 2023, all our measures were down and still declining. And now, at the end of 23, everything changed in a way that had me exclaiming in wonder and praise, "Only God!"



In point of fact, 2023 may just have been our best year yet! We gave away more money through various forms of financial assistance and much needed material goods than we ever have before. We could do that because you gave more generously than ever before. And that's just the start.

Service attendance numbers are also up, and we have new people joining us each week. More importantly, the joy is way up as well. The Holy Spirit is moving, and Sunday mornings feel great again- really, really great in fact. That's been a long time coming.

At St. Matt's, we've always been crystal clear: numbers only matter because they represent lives, the lives of people who matter to God. The lives that matter captured in the next number are the lives of our children and youth. These numbers too are up-- by the end of 2023, Faith Factory had doubled and even tripled in size. The number of youth turning out for Jr. and Middle School events showed a similar dramatic increase. For the first time in 5 years, we had the great joy of sending youth off on a mission trip.

The list goes on and on—the women's retreat, training a new generation of small group leaders, improvement to all our communication platforms driving increased engagement -- but, I trust you get the point and feel the excitement of being part of Saint Matthews at this time in history.

Another characteristic of the very best year in our history is that it has set us up for an even better year to come. At the start of 2023 we paused, even restructuring the vestry (our governing board) to better discern where God is leading us. We knew we couldn't keep doing what we've been doing, but what we needed to do instead was unclear. While there are still plenty of questions, we learned a ton. We gained both direction and vision as the way ahead began coming into focus. And so, in 2024 we are moving forward like never before. There is a holy boldness here now that feels fantastic. At the risk of being repetitive, it is a very, very exciting time.

Invest & Invite

Specifically, here are some ways we're moving ahead: expanded outreach, including further developing HRTS; forming a Capital Campaign Committee; adding new staff; increased volunteer engagement; expanding women's ministry; creating more small groups; continuing to build our children and youth ministries; exploring new services and service improvements; more Bible studies; growing our digital ministry and communication platforms. Whew!!! And in all these things, being clear that we are doing them to deepen our commitment to Jesus.

What's your part? First, INVEST. Invest your one and only life in what truly matters. Ask God, "What would you have me do?" Listen. Act. We don't have to get it exactly right. We do have to keep moving forward and learn on the way.

Second, INVITE. Invite everyone you know to join us! I'm going to go out on a limb and say you are here for a reason. You are here because you are feeling a connection to God in this community that makes you feel more alive. It's a source of positive energy in a too often negative world, and that energy—the Holy Spirit! – makes life good news. So many people all around us are so hungry for this. Invite them, friends. Help them find what you have found, what God has given you. Don't keep it to yourselves.

Finally, I don't want to ever miss an opportunity to say how proud I am of you, how much I enjoy knowing and sharing God's love with you, and how much I love each and every one of you.

Supporting the Community **Outreach**

Throughout 2023, St. Matt's Outreach team continued its heartwarming mission of nourishing the community with food, necessities, gifts, and meaningful relationships, all while feeding our souls with God's love. We expanded our roster of dedicated Outreach leaders and strengthened connections with local school leaders. In addition to enhancing our regular events, we joyfully responded to increased requests from school leaders, readily extending a helping hand. Thanks to the strong bonds forged by our school liaisons and the generosity of our parishioners, who donated food, time, and money, St. Matt's stands out as a well-known community provider.



Haiti Benefit Concert

Our Annual Benefit Concert and BBO for St. Mathieu's school in Chapoteau, Haiti, was an incredible success, raising an impressive \$28,212. The event, now in its third year, attracted Haitians recently granted visas. Their gratitude was witnessed palpable thev the as generosity. With the community's support of Bach 2 Rock and Brian Dodd's delectable BBO, donations poured in. allowing us to provide 250 children and their teachers with nutritious daily meals, including protein-rich options like chicken and fish, alongside vegetables. The outpouring of support ensures a year of well-rounded nourishment beyond the staple beans and rice.









Celebration Garden

St. Matthew's Celebration Garden flourishes as a beacon of generosity, yielding 1500 lbs of fresh, organic produce annually for the LINK food pantry. This year the garden introduced a new cut flower ministry, growing, creating, and distributing 250 vibrant bouquets spreading joy throughout the community.

This year the garden was also the recipient of four Eagle Scout projects introducing new raised beds for the cut flower ministry and reinforcing our commitment to collaboration within our vibrant community.



Care Response Team

The Care Response Team, dedicated to supporting neighbors in need, distributed a heartening 5.4% more diapers and a remarkable 13.6% increase in food bags in 2023. New partnerships with Loudoun County mental health advisors and resource specialists expanded our ability to assist the community. Including the holiday bags, we provided 14,599 diapers, 783 food bags, and over \$10,000 in financial aid for rent, car repairs, medications, childcare, and more. Our mission to fill the world with God's love thrived through outreach efforts, ensuring basic needs were met. One touching story involves Serena, a classroom aide at LCPS, whose family received vital assistance during a challenging time.

Outreach Impact

A leader at one of St. Matt's partner schools approached our school liaison with a request to help a small family who just immigrated to the U.S. - a single mother and her special needs daughter. This family of two had secured housing but did not have furniture and were sleeping on the floor.

The school leader asked if we could help secure a bed. Outreach sprang to action.

I had a barely used queen sized bed in my guest room I just knew would be perfect for them. Within 24 hours we were able to tell them we had what they needed and within a few days, the family had a soft and cozy place to lay their heads at night.

Since we were able to fill this request so quickly, the family liaison reached out again and said that the family also needed a place for their clothes. Our school liaison and another Outreach leader each offered a dresser and delivered this much-needed furniture again in very little time.

I was pleasantly surprised when the school's family liaison sent us the family's expression of thanks and a picture of the mother and daughter sitting on the bed with big smiles on their faces. In just this one conversation, eight people's lives were positively affected - the four St. Matt's parishioners including the school liaison and those who were able to provide the needed furniture, the school's family liaison who arranged the whole thing, the person she found with a truck to make the bed delivery and the family of two who now had some of their basic needs met.

This is the tangible magic of Outreach - the connection of God's people that leave us all walking away feeling Happy and Loved.

Hunger Response Team of Sterling

In 2023, the Hunger Response Team of Sterling (HRTS) made a wonderful impact in fighting insecurity in our community. Through the Backpack Buddies program, HRTS provided six meals a week to over 280 students across six local schools during the school year, ensuring no child went hungry. Their inaugural Giving Tuesday campaign witnessed an overwhelming response from the community, raising an impressive \$25,000!

HRTS continues its commitment to fosterina community engagement bv offering diverse volunteer opportunities for groups and businesses. local Their dedication and community support have been instrumental in making a meaningful impact in the fight against hunger.

With a new board elected in January 2024, HRTS looks forward to a year focused on volunteer development, fundraising, grant writing, and identifying cost saving measures to continue our support to the school children and families in Loudoun County.

Technology/ Live stream

In 2023, the Technology team initiated the renovation of the A/V system and ensured high-quality audio and live stream for all services. Growing in Faith Spiritual Formation

Spiritual formation is the intentional journey of nurturing a profound connection with God, fostering personal transformation to live more like Jesus. Through practices like prayer, Bible study, and community engagement, it leads to holistic spiritual growth and a closer relationship with God.

Bible Study

Our Wednesday night Bible study group (formerly titled WatCh or Wednesdays at Church) had up to 30 attendees each week in 2023. The engaging weekly sessions involved teaching, reflection, and discussions, creating a warm environment for spiritual growth. As a testament to its success, WatCH has evolved into a transformative Bible Study experience, and exciting plans include adding **a new daytime Bible study in 2024,** ensuring continued exploration and connection within our faith community.

Bread of Life

Bread of Life, a Monday evening small group with Zoom option, has expanded from five to nine members in 2023. The group delved into various topics, finding enrichment through history and new ideas, and plans to continue exploring engaging subjects in 2024. New members are always welcome, and suggestions for discussion topics are encouraged.

EfM - Education for Ministry

Education for Ministry is a group of eight participants and two co-mentors who meet every Tuesday evening, 7-9 PM, both in person and via Zoom from September to June. This year we have explored scripture, church history, and theology through study, prayer, worship, and reflection. Recruiting for the upcoming year begins this summer – consider joining us for a life-changing experience starting in September.







Young Professionals

In 2023, the YoPros thrived. With dedication from their small group of around five members, they held 18 meetings and a memorable New Year's Eve party. Rooted in faith, the group supported each other through continuous prayer and Bible study, nurturing a strong sense of community and spiritual growth. Despite their small size, the YoPros are open to growth and outreach, inviting anyone interested to join their uplifting community.







Men's Group




